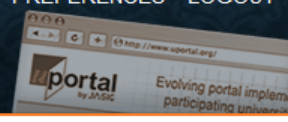

FINANCIAL AID

Financial Aid

At Unicon U, students may receive help in financing their education from a number of different sources. The University offers generous institutional scholarships and grants that are awarded on the basis of academic ability, talent and/or financial need. Students may also receive financial assistance from federal and state financial aid programs.

Applying for financial aid is easy. Simply apply for admission. Once you have been accepted, the Admissions Office will determine if you qualify for an academic award and send you a notification, usually within a few days of your official offer of admission.

To receive additional need-based grants, loans and work awards you will need to file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. You can do that on-line at <http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/>. We recommend that students complete the FAFSA between January 1 and March 15 for the academic year that will begin the following August. Although we award all of our financial aid programs on a rolling basis, funding for some programs is limited. It is best to apply early while funds are still available in all programs.

Course Description and Goals

English 101 emphasizes two things: argumentation and research. Roughly half of the course is devoted to the study of some of the basic principles of argumentation, while the other half of the course focuses on research—that is, on finding and evaluating information—and on incorporating that information into your own writing. Note that there is much overlap here. Each half will result in a major essay. You will, however, have several other writing assignments during the course of the next five weeks.

In this course you will learn—

- * how to identify and utilize the basic principles of argumentation;
- * how to effectively research and focus a topic using library and other research tools;
- * how to construct and write an effective argument-based and/or research-based essay; and
- * how to use the Modern Language Association's style of documentation.

This course will challenge you to expand your critical reading and thinking skills, examining the multiple perspectives, values, and claims surrounding issues, ideas, and questions. I will expect you to participate fully and enthusiastically in discussions and in reading and responding to each other's ideas and arguments.

Note: English 101 is a follow-up to its prerequisite, English 100. If you're taking this class, you should already possess basic essay-writing skills—that is, I assume that you can do such things as select and focus a topic; plan and structure an essay; develop a thesis; write cohesive, unified paragraphs; provide good topic sentences and transitions; etc. All those skills are necessary in English 101, but they are not the primary focus of instruction. If you feel you need additional assistance in writing skills, do not hesitate to let me know.

Class Format

Interaction is essential in this class; therefore, there will be a lot of small-group and whole class activity and very little lecturing. Free-writing, writing, revising, receiving feedback from peers or an instructor, and discussion of readings, others' writing, and ideas will be a significant part of the class and are meant to help you develop as a writer. You will be asked to give your opinions and share your ideas, both in class and on paper, on issues engendered by class discussion or a piece of writing.

Since our room is a computer classroom, we will also do a lot of in-class writing and utilize online resources in class.

Recommended Texts and Materials

- * A large three-ringed binder or some type of folder for your classwork, readings, drafts, essays, and handouts.
- * Disk or jump drive to save your work.

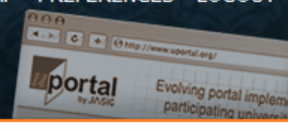

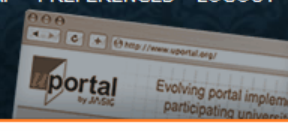
