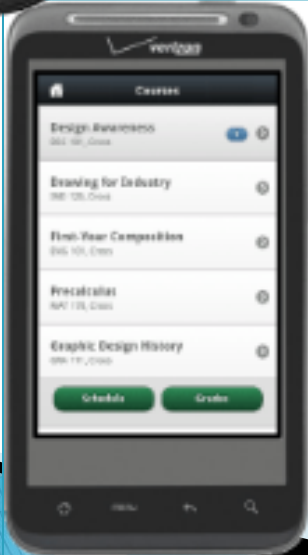
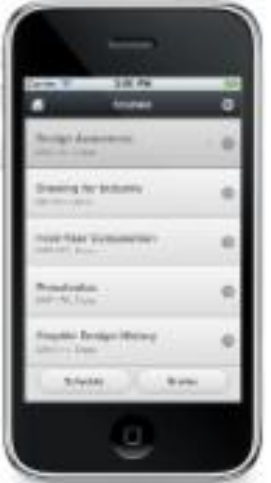
What is Jasig?

- ▶ Jasig is a global consortium of educational institutions and commercial affiliates sponsoring open source software projects which benefit higher education.
- ▶ As a non-profit, 501(c)3 membership group, we organize events promoting open source software planning, design, development, and implementation.
- ▶ Our activities and resources foster collaboration and sharing within and among communities of practice.



A great year – Accomplishments

- ▶ Smartphone sales grew 72% in 2010.
- ▶ Educause just held a Mobile Computing 5 day Sprint.
- ▶ Solution for delivering authenticated, personalized, small applications, self-service interactions.
- ▶ Free and open source.
- ▶ Built on uPortal framework, including single signon via CAS, and the groups and permissions, authentication, personalization, and portlets that exist. Sophisticated control over who sees what.
- ▶ Both browser based (Blackberry, Windows Mobile, webOS) and native app (iOS, Android) solutions.
- ▶ To experience it firsthand download the conference app!





- ▶ uPortal 4 is coming soon.
 - Release Candidate this week.
 - 2nd Release Candidate a month after that.
 - General Availability a month after that.
- ▶ Strengthened support of our existing community
 - 5 Community Call webinars
 - Improved documentation
 - Patches
 - Automatic nightly builds in Amazon cloud

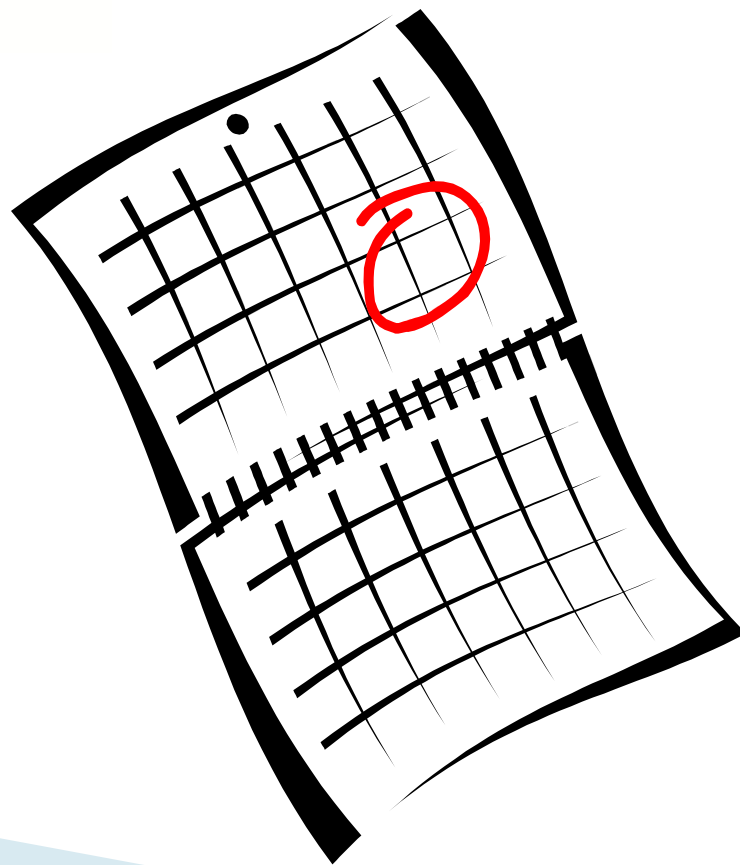




- ▶ Delivered 9 releases of CAS – currently 3.4.8
- ▶ Improvements to management and monitoring
- ▶ X.509 authentication improvements and new features
- ▶ Security and protocol fixes/improvements
- ▶ Released 1.0 version of .NET Client (graduated from incubation)
- ▶ ClearPass released as official CAS extension
- ▶ CasOwa extension provides CAS support for Microsoft Outlook Web Access by building on .NET Client and ClearPass
- ▶ Focus on documentation to facilitate evaluation, installation, and upgrades

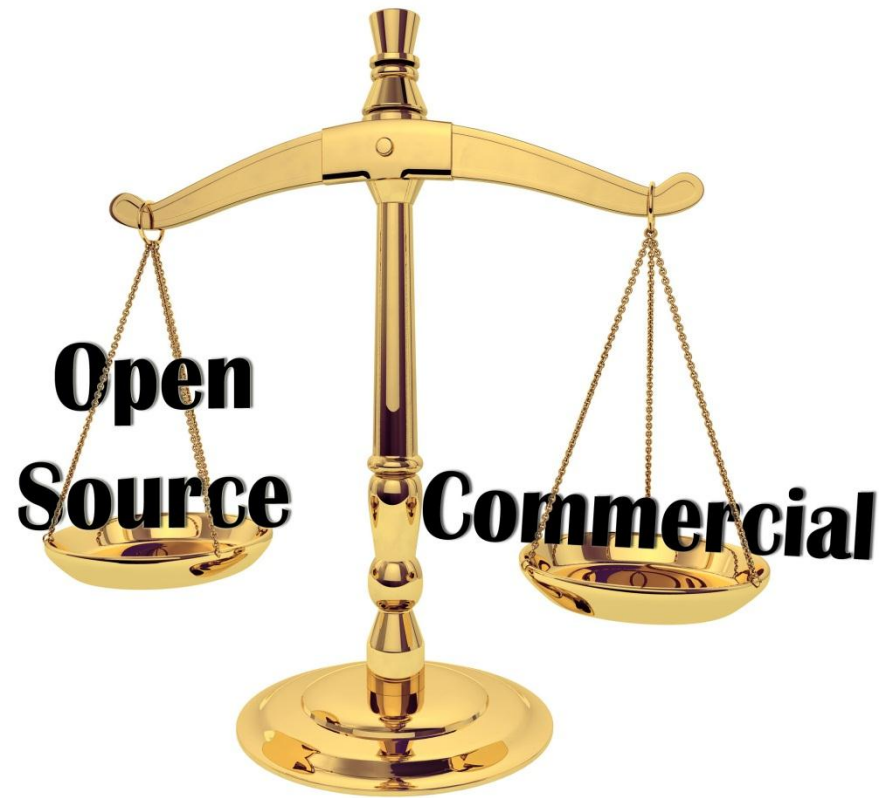


bedework





- ▶ Bedework version 3.7, our first as a Jasig sponsored project, first project out of incubation.
- ▶ Standalone address book web client and CardDAV V4 server
- ▶ Improved internationalization (with German and Spanish translations)
- ▶ Reduced memory footprint
- ▶ Writing new calendaring XML standards, working with CalConnect and Oasis.





- ▶ The name: "2-3-98" references the day in history when the term "open source" was first coined.
- ▶ Community of open source practitioners.
- ▶ Edu2ools: Build on work of WCET's EduTools to formulate evaluation criteria and metrics for open source and commercial applications.

- ▶ Bedework became the first project to emerge from incubation a year ago.
- ▶ Six portlets have passed through the process since then.
- ▶ Defined a process for bringing in a new community of practice.
- ▶ This month the FIFER Project and the .Net CAS client have become fully sponsored Jasig projects.
- ▶ We have 23 projects currently incubating.

- ▶ uMobile – Product Realization and actual adoption.
- ▶ uPortal 4 – General Availability and adoption
- ▶ CAS – Made significant progress on CAS 4.x development; milestone release imminent
- ▶ Jasig–Sakai will make final determinations about joining and what that looks like.



Looking forward...

- ▶ Bedework –
 - Bedework/Exchange synchronization service, based on the emerging standards for web services for calendaring.
 - Working with University of Wisconsin to open source Wisconsin's scheduling assistant software.
- ▶ Projects coming out of incubation
- ▶ Demo sites for uPortal, other projects
